Sharlene is an Outreach Specialist for the Alzheimer's Association Greater WI Chapter. A lifelong resident of northern Wisconsin, Sharlene is deeply connected to small community and family life as well as enjoying the rural and outdoor life this area has to offer.

She has many years experience with the long term care of people with special needs, in a variety of roles from direct care to administration and teaching. She is now a "Foundations of Care" master trainer, "Dementia Care: Best Practices" and "Activity Based Alzheimer's Care" instructor for professional caregivers along with offering dementia education to people newly diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and family caregivers.

As a keynote presenter, programs are designed to enrich lives at home and in health care facilities and to improve quality of life for caregivers, people with dementia, and those who care about them. Her presentation unfolds factual insight into Alzheimer's disease and related dementias, together with storytelling, lecture, audience participation, and demonstration to deepen her audiences understanding of dementia and practical ideas to accompany friends and relatives in this life experience.
